Thank you to all the people who are remembering to close the gates every time they come through. It is making a real difference to the security of the school grounds. We are investigating the possibility of removing the second gate (that doesn't lock easily) and moving the gate so that it is in line with the end of the Harrier's classroom. We are aiming to put in a large and small gate across the space, so that the small gate can be used to enter the playground easily and safely. We hope to get this done as soon as possible.
