### Reading



The New Ofsted Education Inspection Framework now includes a "deep dive" in reading, and this will form part of every inspection for primary schools. The sequence of reading books must show a cumulative progression in phonics knowledge that is matched closely to the school's phonic programme. Although our reading scheme runs loosely alongside the phases of phonics, we have identified it is not quite specific enough and we don't have enough books. Therefore, we have started the arduous task of sorting out our reading scheme so it matches directly and means teachers can give children sufficient practice in reading and rereading books that match the graphemephoneme correspondences they know. This needs to be done both at school and at home. Please be patient with us, as we make the transition. Don't forget to read every night at home, and bring books in every day for changing, if need be.

#### **Attendance**

As it is the start of a new term, we have been analysing our attendance figures once again. There is a major focus on raising attendance in schools by the government and we are asked to monitor it and act when there are persistent offenders. The target for attendance remains at 96% nationwide and we know that good attendance helps children with their progress. Having analysed the information from last term, we can see that most absences have been due to illness. To be clear, we appreciate how difficult it has been for parents and families, as there have been many mixed messages over the last couple of years since COVID - one minute it is stay at home, and the next it's come into school. Very confusing and frustrating for many. That said, this term is a suitable time to start a fresh. We would encourage you to bring your children into school as much as possible. Little sniffs, coughs and colds should not be a reason to keep them at home. They are missing crucial elements of their education and it impacts on friendships, mental health, and wellbeing. On a physical level, we want to build up the immune systems of your young people after lock downs. If your child's attendance falls below 90%, they are classed as a persistent absentee. We will therefore be contacting parents where attendance is in danger of falling below 90%. We value your support when trying to improve our attendance throughout school and we will continue to be as understanding as possible. Please, just come and talk to us if you are worried or want to share further information that will inform patterns of attendance.
