I know that the Exodus is a significant event in Jewish and Christian history. that the Seder is the special meal celebrated by Jews on the first evening of the festival of Passover. that Christianity is rooted in Judaism and Jesus celebrated the Passover. that for Jewish people the events of the Exodus and Passover are very important, that Christians remember the Passover and the Last Supper during the Eucharist. retell the Exodus story highlighting the connections to the Seder meal. make links between the Passover, Last Supper and the Eucharist, tell you why Passover is a festival of memory and freedom. express my opinions about freedom, what it is and what it is not. tell you about the similarities and differences between the importance placed on the Passover by Jews and Christians. explain why the Passover is not forgotten that the Eucharist is an important celebration. that the Eucharist is celebrated by Christians worldwide. that there is a direct link between the life and words of Jesus and the Eucharist. make links between Christian beliefs, the Eucharist and the Last Supper. use good religious vocabulary to show understanding of why Christians celebrate the Eucharist. identify the similarities and differences within and between the way Christian denominations celebrate the Eucharist. talk about the way in which the Eucharist service answers questions about Christian beliefs. explain what the words remembrance, holy, sacrifice, mercy, salvation and faith mean to Christians and to me.	I know the stories of significant women in the Old Testament, the Jewish Festival of Purim celebrates how God used Esther to save his people, that being a person of faith isn't always easy. respond sensitively to questions about my own experiences and those of others, make a link between my own values and the values and commitments of the women in the Bible. use religious vocabulary to show that I understand the actions and beliefs of the women in the Old Testament. ask good questions and suggest answers about belonging, commitment, truth and values, talk about the impact the lives of the women whose stories we explored had on God's great salvation plan. describe what inspires me about the lives of the women in the Bible, that Christians believe God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Trinity, that Bible stories are used to answer questions about God and can talk about them. that there are similarities and differences between the names given to God by people of all world faiths. retell Bible stories that reveal the nature and characteristics of God. talk with understanding and use religious language to explain the Trinity, identify Christian beliefs about God in prayers and worship songs. express my own opinion and ask big questions. identify the similarities and differences between beliefs about God across world faiths.

Topic outcomes	I know that harvest is celebrated by people of all faiths and none. harvest is mentioned throughout the Old Testament. there is a connection between Christian belief and behaviour in relation to celebrating the harvest. I can: tell you about the stories found in the Bible. tell you why the Bible is so important to Christians. tell you about the Qumran scrolls and Mary Jones. name the holy books from world faiths that I have investigated. describe the similarities and differences between holy books, including the Bible. that the church is a special place where Christians meet to worship and pray. It is also the body of people and not just the building, that for Christians the church is a holy blessed space. I know: the story of Moses and the people of God building the tabernacle (tent of meeting) to house the ark of the covenant. that world faiths have special holy places of worship, what these buildings are called, their key features, and the worship that takes place there. ask good questions that reveal understanding about the church and what happens there. connect the features of the church to Bible Stories. use religious vocabulary to name and describe the features of a church building and other places of worship. describe a few similarities and differences between places of worship.

Topic outcomes	David is a key figure in God's plan for his people. some Christians have had to endure great struggles and persevere in difficult circumstances to keep faith in God and follow his way. retell stories about David. recognise their own values and the values of others. connect Christian values and beliefs to events and teaching in the Bible. ask important and relevant questions. show that they understand how the imagery of the Psalms reveals Christian beliefs about the nature of God. I know Advent is a time of preparation and the season of hope. during Advent the church spends time focussing on the promise of Jesus' return. Christians believe that Jesus is the promised Messiah, but Jewish people do not. different denominations within Christianity hold differing beliefs about the importance and status of Mary. the themes of Advent tell the 'big story' of God's salvation plan. I can: explain how Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament prophecies. use religious vocabulary to describe the symbolism, practices, beliefs and themes of the season of Advent.	I know: that Jesus' teaching explains Christian beliefs. that Jesus' teaching makes an impact on people's lives. the elements of Jesus teaching that can be directly linked to our school Christian values and British values.
